Selling Tobacco?

Don't sell to under 18 year olds

No ID No sale – under 18

By law a tobacco retailer or their employee must ask for proof of age identification if there is any doubt that a purchaser of tobacco is 18 years or older. Always ask to see photographic identification. Using the date of birth on the purchaser's ID is an easy way to confirm a person's age.
