

## Haemoptysis

- Major Haemoptysis - > 200ml – refer to Emergency Department.
- Small volume haemoptysis – in the setting of antiplatelet and anticoagulant therapy could be related to current treatment regime.
- Unexplained small volume haemoptysis contact respiratory registrar.

### Information Required

- Volume of Haemoptysis
  - Major haemoptysis: > 200ml blood loss
  - Streaks of blood in sputum
- Current medications – detail antiplatelet & anticoagulant therapy.
- Reason for referral
- Associated symptoms
  - Breathlessness, pleuritic chest pain
- Duration of symptoms
- Past medical history
- Smoking history

### Investigations Required

- Relevant pathology and imaging reports
- Chest X-ray & CT imaging (CTPA if PE is a consideration).
- Full blood exam and coagulation studies.

## Red Flags

### Refer immediately send to Flinders Medical Centre Emergency department

- ☞ Major Haemoptysis
  - >200ml blood loss
  - Haemoptysis with Hypotension/Haemodynamic compromise

### Refer urgently – contact Respiratory Registrar at Flinders Medical Centre

- ☞ Moderate Haemoptysis with ongoing uncontrolled haemoptysis
  - <200ml blood loss

## Suggested GP Management

- Major haemoptysis – Refer to ED
- Minor haemoptysis – case review and consider discussion with respiratory team if indicated.
- If associated with intercurrent bronchitis treat infection
- If current smoker advise cessation
