Pest Management Technician competencies

All pesticide licences are issued with endorsements. Endorsements show what kinds of pesticides may be used and what kinds of pest control work may be undertaken.

Endorsements on a Full Pest Management Technician (FPMT) licence are determined by which courses have been successfully completed.

Endorsements on a Limited Pest Management Technician (LPMT) licence are restricted to the endorsements on the licence of their supervising FPMT.

It is an offence to do pest control work that your licence is not endorsed for.

Pest control endorsements

Domestic and Commercial Pest Control

The control of common domestic pests such as insects, spiders, wasps, rats, mice, ants and termites in and around private homes and commercial buildings. It may also include some minor use of herbicides in domestic or commercial situations.

Control of Weeds

The control of weeds using herbicides in any setting (except viticultural settings) including fields, broad acre crops, pastures, native vegetation, along roadsides, in orchards, sports grounds, timber plantations and vegetable, flower and nut crops.

Control of Weeds and Plant Pests

The control of weed, insect and fungal pests using herbicides, insecticides and fungicides in any setting (except viticultural settings) including fields, broad acre crops, pastures, native vegetation, along roadsides, in orchards, sports grounds, timber plantations and vegetable, flower and nut crops.

Fumigation Pest Control

The control of a range of pests such as insects, weeds and fungus in soil, stacks, silos or ships using fumigant gases, mainly for quarantine purposes, the protection of grain and other food commodity stores, and soil treatment. Fumigation Pest Control does not cover the use of fumigants in Vertebrate Pest Control.

Vertebrate Pest Control

The control of larger pest species such as wild rabbits and dogs, foxes, and feral cats and pigs.

• Viticultural Pest Control

The control of pests such as weeds, insects and fungus in grape vines or vineyards.



Pest control endorsements – continued

Agricultural Pilots/Aerial Agricultural Pest Control

The control of weed, insect and fungal pests in agricultural settings eg. broad acre crops, with the pesticide distributed from an aircraft.

• Stump Treatment

The treatment of plant/tree stumps to prevent regrowth using a limited range of chemicals.

Training competency units required by endorsement sought:

Limited Pest Management Technician Licence (with Direct Supervision)

Limited Pest Management Technician (LPMT) licences are issued to people who want to start working in the pest control industry but have not started or completed their training.

The holder of a LPMT licence is entitled to carry out pest control work but **only** under **Direct**Supervision: the Limited Pest Management Technician must be within sight AND sound of their supervisor.

Training competency units required by endorsement sought:

Limited Pest Management Technician Licence (with Indirect Supervision)

Indirect Supervision is optional – the LPMT must be within sight OR sound of their FPMT supervisor (ie. phone contact). The authority for a LPMT to work under Indirect Supervision can only be granted by Controlled Substance Licensing (CSL).

To be eligible, the LPMT must demonstrate the requirements listed below:

The holder of a FPMT licence can undertake pest control work for "fee or reward" without supervision. To be eligible you must have successfully completed the training relevant to the type of pest control work you will be doing, as listed in the following table (overleaf):
