- Unintentional poisoning
- Deliberate poisoning
- Medicinal misadventures
- Diversion for abuse or manufacture of substances of abuse
- Misuse and abuse of illicit substances
- Trafficking in, and manufacture of, illicit substances.

To provide the Minister with appropriate advice in a timely manner.

Objectives

The Controlled Substances Advisory Council:

- reviews the substances that are controlled under the Controlled Substances
 Act 1984 or that may need to be controlled and the controls that should apply
 to them;
- advises the Minister about measures that should be taken in relation to adding, removing or changing the controls;
- monitors the administration and operation of the Act;
- makes recommendations to the Minister for changes to the Controlled Substances legislation.

Controlled Substances Act 1984

11—Functions of the Advisory Council

(6) The Advisory Council must, not later than 31 October in each year, report to the Minister on the administration and operation of this Act during the previous financial year.

In 2016-17 the Advisory Council considered a range of matters, of note were:

- proposed amendments to the Controlled Substances (Controlled Drugs, Precursors and Plants) Regulations 2014 to take account of new psychoactive substances
- amendments to the Controlled Substances (Poisons) Regulations 2011 to implement national uniform controls for Schedule 5, 6 and 7 poisons
- remaking the Controlled Substances (Pesticides) Regulations 2003.

The Advisory Council reviewed and made recommendations to the Minister about the following drugs:

- Designer benzodiazepines
- Prescribed amounts for alprazolam, flunitrazepam, lisdexamfetamine, morphine, nabiximols (Sativex), oxycodone and tapentadol
- Fentanyl derivatives
- 3,4-dichloro-N-[2-(dimethylamino)cyclohexyl]-N-methylbenzamide (U-47700).

The Advisory Council reviewed and advised the Minister about amendments to the regulations related to:

- Cannabis and tetrahydrocannabinols for human therapeutic use
- Low THC Cannabis sativa seeds and seed products as food
- Uniform Controls over Schedule 5, 6 and 7 poisons
- Remaking the Controlled Substances (Pesticides) Regulations 2003.
