# **Gastro-oesophageal Reflux (GORD)**

• GORD can manifest in a multitude of symptoms, the most common being heartburn and regurgitation

## **Information Required**

- Presence of Red flags
- Symptom duration
- Treatment prescribed

### **Fax Referrals to**

#### Gastroenterology

Patients aged ≥50yrs, those with red flag features or with symptoms refractory to PPI after a minimum of two
months should be referred to Gastroenterology for endoscopy

#### **Oesophago-Gastric Surgical Unit**

 Typical reflux symptoms (heartburn and or regurgitation) and ongoing significant symptoms despite regular high dose PPI use consider referral to Oesophago-Gastric Surgical Unit for laparoscopic fundoplication Flinders Medical Centre 8204 5555

## **Red Flags**

Weight loss

Anaemia

Anorexia

Persistent vomiting



Dysphagia

Gastrointestinal bleeding

Epigastric mass

# **Suggested GP Management**

If the patient is aged <50yrs with no red flag features, the following is recommended:

- Empirical treatment with proton-pump inhibitor (PPI). This can be increased to twice daily dosing if symptoms are not relieved by once daily dosing
- Advise weight loss if patient is overweight or obese
- Avoidance of precipitating factors (coffee, chocolate, alcohol, fatty foods, acidic foods and carbonated drinks)
- Elevation of head of the bed if heartburn or regurgitation occurs predominantly when recumbent
